

Blakeney Point Walk

Distance: 3.5 miles

Time: 1.5 hours

Type: Linear

Difficulty: Easy

- 1. From the NWT car park at Cley Beach walk onto the shingle ridge towards the sea and turn left. When the tide is out, you can walk along the beach, which is much easier underfoot.
- 2. Half way along the ridge you will come across the very photogenic Watch House, continue along the beach for another mile from here.
- 3. At the start of the main dunes, walk onto the top of the ridge and turn left, away from the sea.
- 4. Continue along the track towards the blue Lifeboat House, keeping the main dunes and fence line on your right. In this area there may be seals outside of the fence lines ensure you give them a wide berth as they can be particularly aggressive, especially if they have a pup.
- 5. Once you reach the crest of the boardwalk you have arrived at the furthest point of the walk. From here there are fantastic elevated views of the surrounding dunes and landscape. You may also see seals and their pups here during breeding season. Please do not enter fenced areas, for your own safety and that of the seals.
- 6. From here, turn right and walk back along the beach, with the sea on your left, returning all the way to Cley Beach car park.

Dogs are not allowed on Blakeney Point between 1st April and 15th August due to ground nesting birds, and at all other times must be kept on short leads. Although you may see seals on the walk, it is not possible to see the seal colony on Blakeney Point on foot, as this part of the spit is closed off. If you wish to see the seals then you'll need to take a boat trip from Blakeney or Morston Quay.
